Zebra stripes are like fingerprints. No two zebras are alike. This helps to identify individuals!

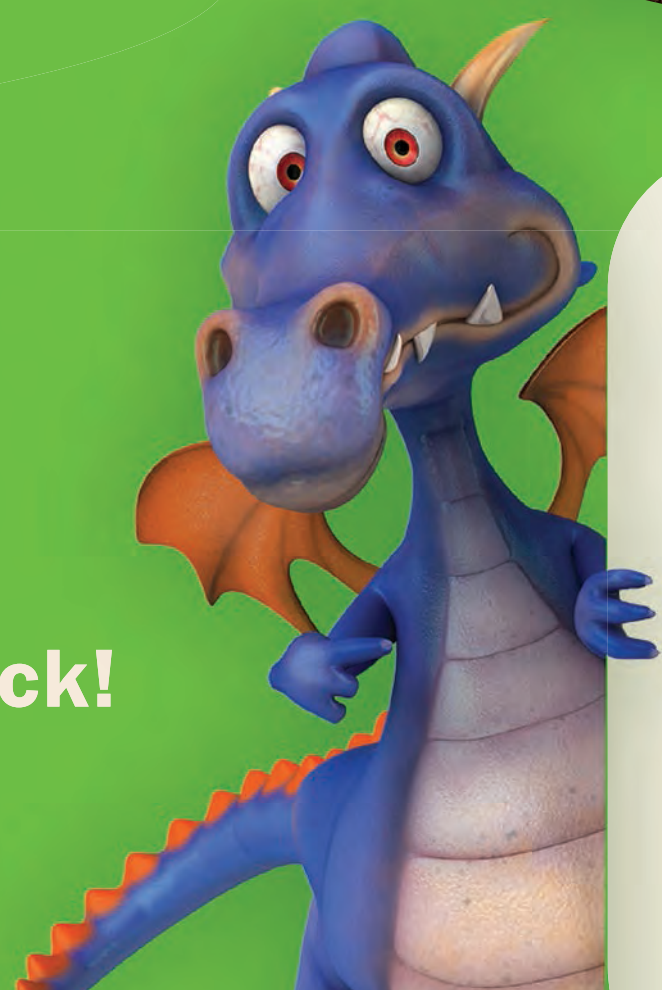


The first camels lived in North America about 40 million years ago. They died out in North America after spreading to other continents!

In most European stories, dragons are symbols of evil. In most Asian legends, dragons are good creatures and symbols of power and luck!



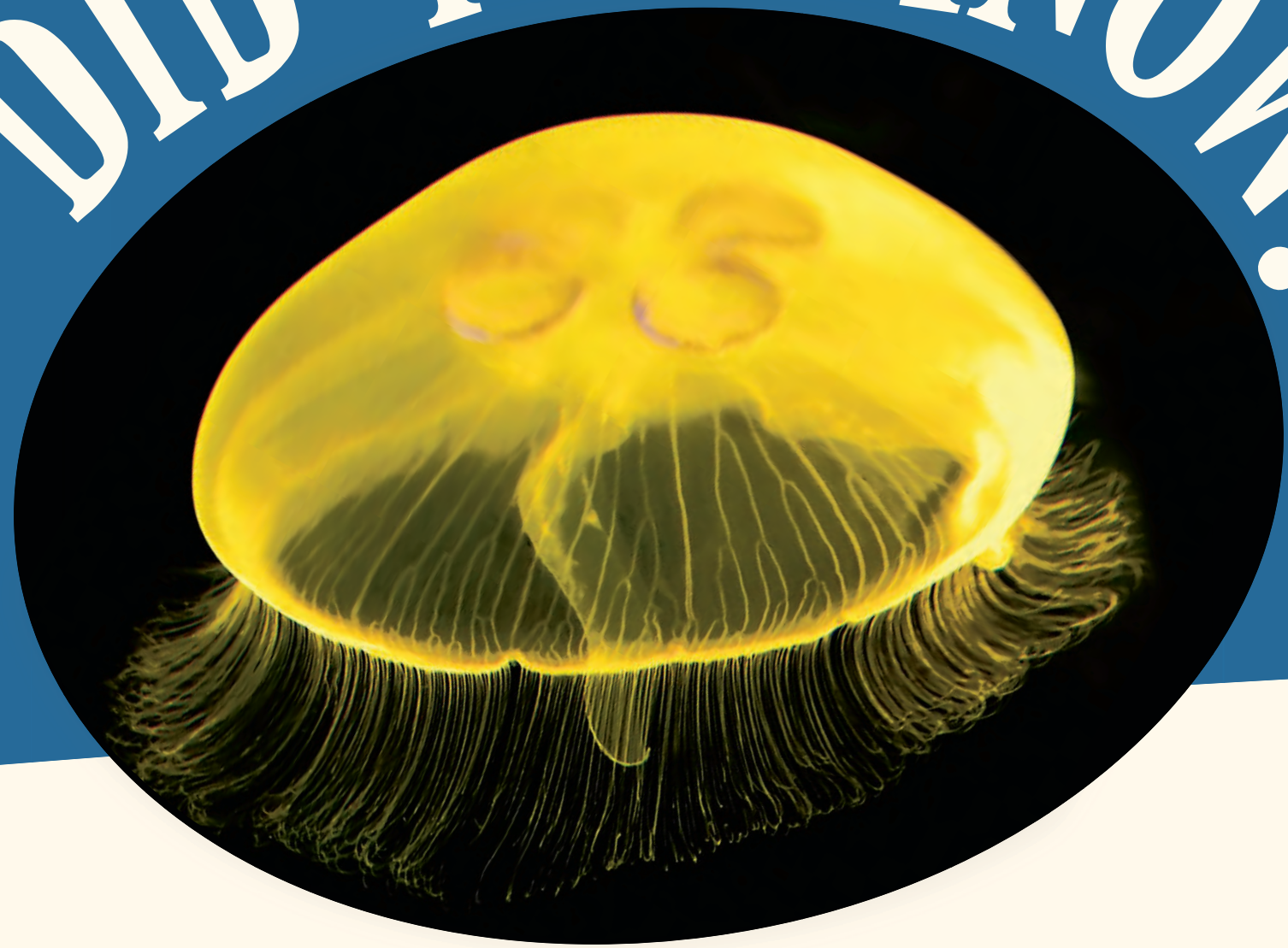

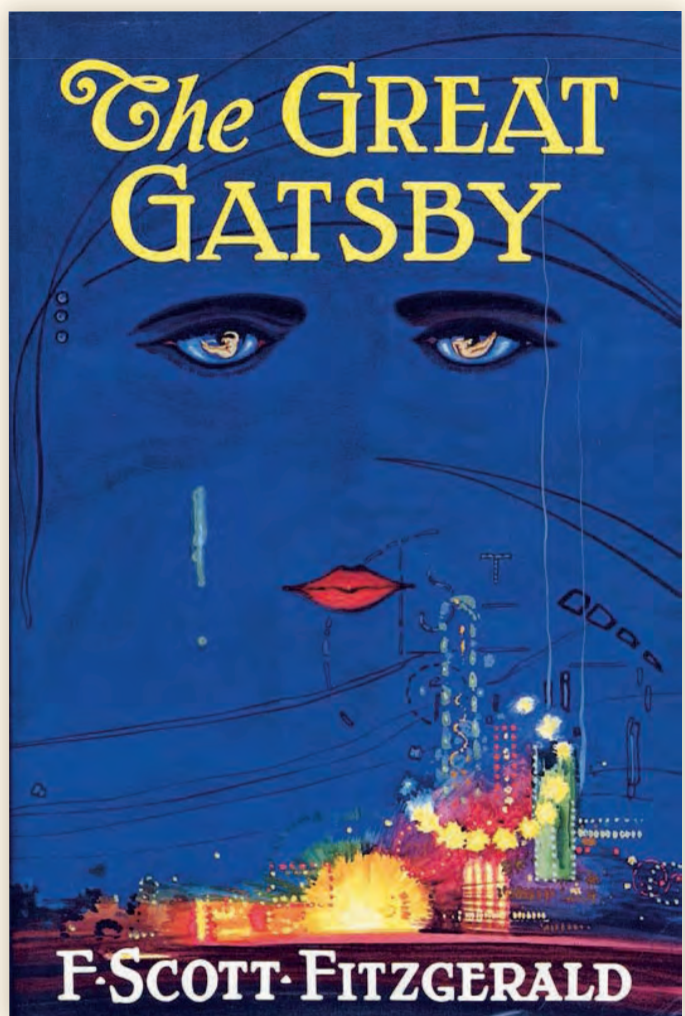


Jellyfish are not actually fish. They belong to a group of much simpler living things called cnidarians.
